


Our Medical Library Wants to Hear from YOU!

Writing Good Narrative Feedback

All feedback is extremely important to our students' development and growth, and summative (final) narrative feedback may be used on the Medical Student Performance Evaluation (or MSPE, formerly known as the Dean's Letter).

Here are a few tips and tricks for writing great narrative feedback:

- Feedback should be **specific**, focused on observed behaviors or skills
- o Feedback should be **constructive**, focused on potential actions
- o Feedback should be timely, focused on the recent past
- Feedback should be in *complete sentences* with proper grammar and punctuation
