

FLIPPED LEARNING

Flipped learning is a "pedagogical approach in which direct instruction moves from the group learning space to the individual learning space, and the resulting group space is transformed into a **dynamic**, **interactive learning environment** where the educator guides students as they apply concepts and engage creatively in the subject matter".



BEST PRACTICES

- Create opportunites for prelearning.
- Assign didactic material to be learned before class
- Use face-to-face time for active learning.
- Use backward instructional design



TIPS FOR FLIPPED LEARNING

PREPARATION

Use recognized educational theory and evidence-based techniques. Be aware of the timelines involved with converting to a flipped classroom.



EXECUTION Use class time creatively and effectively.



REFLECTION

Use formative assessment and work on learning gaps.
